TO KEEP YOU IN THE BIG PICTURE

Fair share: The Commission has welcomed a global agreement endorsed by G20 Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors on 10 July, which will result in the world's largest companies having to pay tax wherever they conduct business. At the same time, a global minimum effective tax rate of at least 15% will help curb aggressive tax planning and stop the corporate tax "race to the bottom." European Commissioner for Economy Paolo Gentiloni said: "...we have until October to finalise this agreement. I am optimistic that we will be able in that time also to reach a consensus among all European Union Member States on this crucial issue." More.

It's all about values: In a recent resolution, Parliament "condemns in the strongest possible terms" the recent anti-LGBTIQ legislation and denounces the dismantling of democracy and the rule of law in Hungary". MEPs call on the Commission to launch an accelerated infringement procedure and to use all tools in the Court of Justice, such as interim measures and penalties for non-compliance if necessary. Growing strong (and counting): The Summer 2021 interim <u>Economic Forecast</u> projects that the economy in the EU and the euro area is set to expand by 4.8% this year and 4.5% in 2022. The European economy is forecast to rebound faster than previously expected, as activity in the first quarter of the year exceeded expectations and the improved health situation prompted a swifter easing of pandemic control restrictions in the second guarter. People's climate: The latest Eurobarometer survey on Climate Change reveals that climate change is now considered the single most serious global problem by Europeans. In spite of the COVID-19 pandemic, Europeans remain very concerned about climate change and support action across the EU to tackle it. On the survey page you will find much more. Linked to this, tomorrow the Commission will adopt the big and long-awaited package on the Green Deal.

Your plans have been approved: The Commission has given green light to the recovery and resilience plans of Cyprus and Croatia. This is an important step towards the EU disbursing a total of €1.2 billion in grants and loans to Cyprus and €6.3 billion in grants and loans to Croatia under the Recovery and Resilience Facility, and a good piece to promote for our centres in the two countries.
